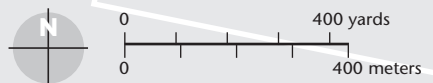
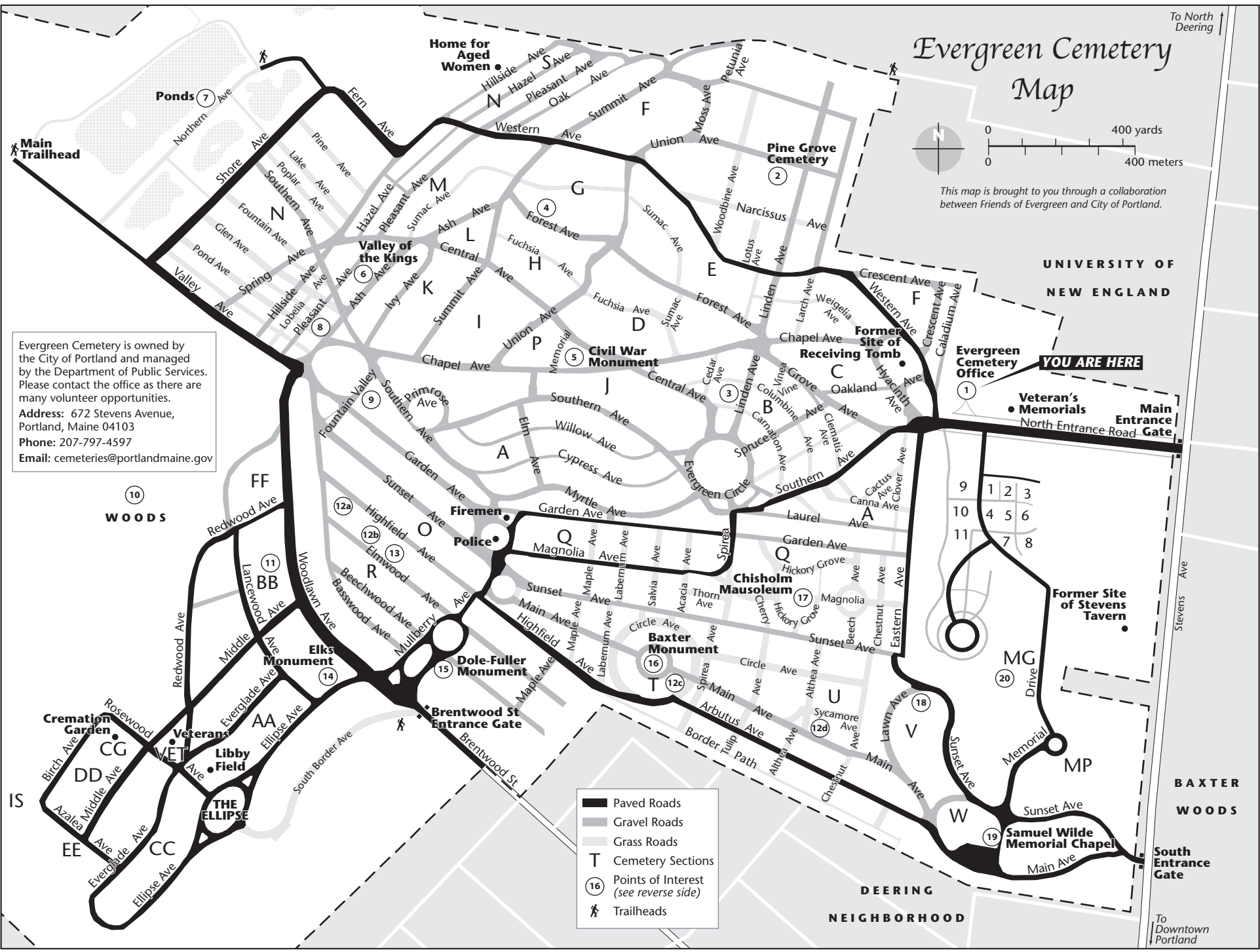


Evergreen Cemetery Map
